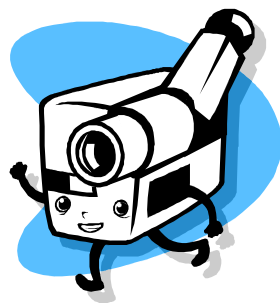

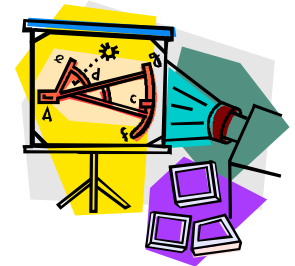

impacts on a watershed. A great visual aid for studying water pol-
lution sources!*

Ground Water Flow Model (requires district assistance)
*This model provides a look into the ground and shows how water
moves underground. Also a great visual for groundwater pollution
impacts and water withdrawal. Due to its complexity, district staff
must accompany model.*
