### Deciduous

**Sugar Maple** – 12-18" seedlings, can grow to 75'. It does not do well in wet areas. Native, provides products from sap in the spring.

**Red Oak** – 12-18" seedlings, can grow to 75', fast growing, red to red brown leaves in Autumn.

**Black Walnut** – 6-12" seedlings, can grow 50+', native and known for edible nuts and wood.

### Evergreens

**Norway Spruce** – (2-0) 5-12" seedlings, can grow to 150'. Good for Christmas trees, timber and windbreaks. Thrives in ordinary soils: needs good moisture to keep green color. Space 6' apart.

**Fraser Fir** – (2-0) 3-6" seedlings, good for ornamentals and Christmas trees. Cool soils and north exposure.

**Eastern Hemlock** – (2-0) 5-12" seedlings, grows well in variety of soils. Plant in part shade but sun and full shade will work. Like moisture. Excellent for hedges.

### Semi-Dwarf Trees

Two-year tree pruned to a 1 1/16" to 3/4" branch, 5' high. Most require two different varieties for proper pollination.

### Apple Trees

**Northern Spy** – Crisp, tender all-purpose. Blooms late, avoiding most late spring frosts. Ripens in late October. Superior winter apple.

**Macoun** – A dark red with a firm white flesh. A good dessert apple.

**Empire** – A good eating apple. Keeps well when refrigerated. A hardy productive tree.

**Yellow Delicious** – A firm, crisp, juicy flesh. Keeps well. Trees produce young and heavily. Ripens in mid-October.

**Pink Lady** – Oblong fruit with a pink blush over yellow overtone creamy white flesh. A sweet-tart flavor. Has a long storage life. Ripens in November.

**Fuji** - Reddish green fruit, flavorful, crunchy, juicy white flesh. Excellent storage life. Ripens in late September to early October.

### Cherry Trees

1 1/16" to 3/4" 5' high  
Maturity at 10-12 ft.

**Stella** – Ripens in mid-July. Very sweet black cherries and very productive. A good pollinator for other cherry trees.

**Lapins** – Ripens in late June. Dark red/black sweet cherry with firm flavorful flesh. Self-pollinating.

### Blueberry Bushes

Thrive almost anywhere in acid soil; in alkaline soils, add aluminum sulfate. Plant two different varieties for best results. Like full sun.  
3 year, 18" – 24"

**Berkeley** – Ripen mid-season. Very large sweet berries.

**Jersey** – Ripen late. Grows vigorously, large fruit.

### Grapes

**Canadice** – Seedless, Red, extra hardy.

**Concord** – Seedless, Blue.

### Strawberries

**Seascape** – Everbearing and cold hardy. Large, firm and flavorful berries.

### Currants

**Red Lake** – Produce clusters of red berries that are good for eating, jams and jellies. Ripen in mid-July.

### Native/Wildlife/Stream Enhancement

**Sawtooth Oak** – 6-12" seedlings. Fast growth to 50 feet. Tolerates most soils. Space 20 feet apart for best acorn production. Should produce within 7-10 years. Excellent for WILDLIFE.

**Sweet Crabapple** – 10 – 12" seedlings. Grows to 20-30 feet. Likes moist, well drained acidic soil.

**American Elderberry** – 12-15" seedlings. – Root Stock. It is a fast-growing shrub, grown for its clusters of bluish-black berries, which appear in late summer. It is great for jams and for wildlife.

**Gray Dogwood** – 12-18" seedlings, creamy white flowers, produce white berries. Tolerates dry or moist soils, shady or sun.

**Shadblow Serviceberry** – 1-2' seedlings. Grows to 25-30 feet. Blooms early Spring. Red berries are attractive to birds.

**Streamco Willow** – 2 ft cut backs. Grows 12-15 Feet. Dark blue-green leaves with light gray/olive gray stems. Likes cleared, moist soil along stream banks. Disease and insect resistant.
