“EXCAVATION – HOTTENSTEIN”

The Sullivan County Conservation District will be accepting sealed bids for the excavation of a roofed concrete barnyard / manure storage facility to be constructed in Forks Township, Sullivan County, PA. Excavation work is to include materials for installing Erosion & Sediment Control measures, perimeter drain, riser pipes and underground outlets, tile lines, site preparation, compact fill, and stone to reach subgrade elevations, place stone base under concrete, install surface water controls, install outlet pipes and rock aprons, install pressure tank and connect livestock pipeline, install access roads, walkways, improvement of an existing stream crossing, complete final grading, seed all disturbed areas, as well as all other aspects as outlined in the Project Bid Documents, Design Drawings, and Technical Specifications.
