Deciduous

Black Cherry – 12-18" seedlings, can grow to 70', extremely valuable timber tree, also good for wildlife. Does best in rich, moist, soils.

Red Oak – 12-18" seedlings, can grow to 75', fast growing, red to red brown leaves in Autumn.

White Oak – 12-18" seedlings, can grow to 90'. Will grow in wet areas, best in rich loamy soils, full sun. Resistant to ice breakage and oak wilt.

Evergreens

Norway Spruce – (2-0) 5-10" seedlings, can grow to 150', Good for Christmas trees, timber and windbreaks. Thrives in ordinary soils needs good moisture to keep green color. Space 6' apart.

Fraser Fir – (2-0) 3-6" seedlings, can grow to 100'. Easy to care for. Very good as Christmas trees. Needs good drainage.

Eastern White Pine – (2-0) 4-8" seedlings, can grow to 50 ft, extremely hardy, will grow in moist soils and well drained, tolerates heat and drought. It will grow where many others will not.

Semi-Dwarf Trees

Two-year tree pruned to a 1/2" to 7/8" branch, 5' high. Most require two different varieties for proper pollination.

Apple Trees

Cortland – Heavy-bearing, ruby red, very crispy, great in toss salads. Great for pies and cider. Ripens in mid-September.

Golden Delicious – High quality all-purpose apple. Medium fruit, dark red over green background. Ripens late September, holds well in chilled storage.

Honeycrisp – Crisp sweet, and juicy. Ripens Mid-September.

Northern Spy – Crisp, tender all-purpose. Blooms late, avoiding most late spring frosts. Ripens in late October. A superior winter apple.

Pioneer Mac – Smooth with glassy shine.

Pear Trees

Red Capps – An early maturing, fresh market variety, ripening 10 days earlier than Bartlett. Red color, medium to large, fine white flesh and good quality. Vigorous productive but should not be planted where fire blight is a problem.

Harrow Sweet - Ripens 3 weeks later after Bartlett, Resistant to fire blight. Blush color, size, and appearance similar to Bartlett. Should be thinned to maintain fruit size and to avoid biennial bearing.

Blueberry Bushes

Thrive almost anywhere in acid soil; in alkaline soils, add aluminum sulfate. Plant two different varieties for the best results. Like full sun.

Blueray – to mid-Recommended for the northeast. Highly flavored fruit. Very productive bushes, free from disease. Ripens in early July.

Elliott – Ripen late. Grows vigorously, large fruit. 2YR-12"

Grapes & Raspberry

Concord Grapes - Seedless, blue color. Tops for jams, juice, wine. Slightly smaller fruit. Ripens mid-September.

Reliance Grapes - A red seedless variety having a medium to large sized clusters of berries. Skin is tender and flesh has a melting texture with excellent flavor. Ripens 3 weeks prior to concord.

Raspberry Heritage- Everbearing. Produce large firm excellent quality fruit. Start ripening early July.

Strawberries

Seascape – Everbearing and cold hardy. Large, firm, and flavorful berries.

Native/Wildlife/Stream Enhancement

Sawtooth Oak –12-18" seedlings. Fast growth to 50'. Tolerates most soil. Space 20' apart for best acorn production. Should produce within 7-10 years. Excellent for WILDLIFE.

Paw Paw – 12-18' Small, short trunked tree.

American Elderberry – 12-18" seedlings. – Root Stock. It is a fast-growing shrub, grown for its clusters of bluish-black berries, which appear in late summer. It is great for jams and for wildlife.

Tulip Poplar -12-18" seedlings. Can grown to 150 ft. Rapid growth in light well drained soils. Very valuable hardwood timber.

White Dogwood – 12-18" seedlings. Grows up to 30' tall. Dark green foliage turns scarlet red in the fall. Clusters of White flower blooms in May. Red cluster berries in the fall.

Northeast Perennial & Annual Wildflower Mix

10.4% Cosmos; 10% Bachelor's Button Tall Mixed/Cornflower 8% Purple Coneflower; 7.9% Scarlet Flax; 6% Lanceleaf Coreopsis; 6% Rocket Larkspur; 6% Blackeyed Susan; 5.4% Bigleaf Lupine; 4% Tree Mallow; 3.5% Perennial Blue Flax; 3.3% Crimson Clover; 3% California Orange Poppy; 3% Oxeye Sunflower; 2.5% Shasta Daisy; 2% Wallflower; 2% Red Prairie Coneflower; 1.5% Common Yarrow; 1.5% Marsh Blazing Star; 1.2% Narrowleaf Mountain mint; 1% Sweet Alyssum; 1% Tall White Beardtongue; 1% Ohio Spiderwort; .8% Wild Bergamot; .8% Corn Poppy Red; .5% Butterfly Milkweed; .5% Smooth Blue Aster; .5% Zigzag Aster; .5% Blue False Indigo; .5% Clarkia; .2% Catchfly; .2% Gray Goldenrod; .1% Licorice Scented Goldenrod

Number of 2 Year Fertilizer Tablets per Size Plant

1 Tablet - All seedlings, transplants

2 Tablets – Container grown plants, roses.

1 Tablet – For each ½ inch trunk diameter, large trees & evergreens

Tablets are 10 grams each, 20% Nitrogen, 10% Phosphoric Acid, 5% Potash.
